It's that time again. Summer is just about over and fall is starting. I don't want to rush the season, but the first division meeting of the year is just three weeks away. That would be September 19. May I be the first to welcome you back.

At the last board meeting, we discussed the programs and trips for the upcoming season. The schedule, at this point, is just tentative, but this is what we are working on: a clinic by Badger Airbrush, a clinic on Operation Lifesaver, a trip to Trainfest, operating a layout, a trip to the live steamers, our annual auction and our annual holiday party. And again this year, all of our meetings will be held at the Gary Morava Recreation Center in Prospect Heights on the third Sunday of the month starting at 1:30 PM. The schedule will soon be published on the division web site.

For a number of years, the Fox Valley Division has supported a model railroad. That model railroad, the Fox Valley Railroad, has been kept in a garage in Arlington Heights and it was available to any member of the division who wanted to either work on it or run trains on it. However, not many members took advantage of that. The Board of Directors has decided, since the

participation was limited to just a few members of the division, to divest itself of that asset. So the railroad is being sold to a group of members who will form a club and own the railroad. That club is the Fox Valley Model Railroad Club. The model railroad will still be housed in a garage in Arlington Heights, although only a part of it. (The garage will soon be undergoing renovation to make it more hospitable.) Currently, the railroad club is looking for members. If you live near the Arlington Heights area and would like to join a modular model railroad club, contact me and I will give you all the information.

As some of you know, I am in the process of building a Sn3 layout. I thought I would give you an update on that venture. First, the background: The track plan based on a Milwaukee Road narrow gauge railroad that ran 36 miles from Bellevue, Iowa to Cascade, Iowa. The railroad was "Iowa's Slim Princess," and was better known as the Bellevue and Cascade RR. The railroad ceased operation in April of 1936. However, this is where I take up the story. In the summer of 1936, a group of investors purchase the railroad and go from there. It is now the summer of 1943 and America is at war. The railroad is busy hauling food and lumber to support the war effort.

At this point in time, the backdrop has already been mounted to the wall and painted. I am now working on the benchwork. Because the benchwork will be mounted to the wall, all the wood supports are

Attending the National Convention is always a learning experience. 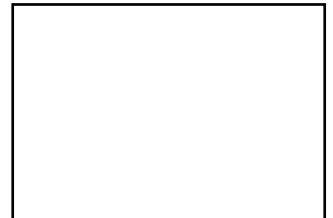
