Remember, I was trying to convince you all that this was being done for the benefit of "the kid." As the theme of last month's column indicated, sometimes we lose track of the original goal.

This month, I'm going to start with a quote from Epictetus (55-135 AD):

If you want to be a writer, write

The same applies to model railroading, although I don't always follow my own advice. I received something in the mail

this week that helped me along, though. I received the first "Dream -Plan - Build" DVD from Model Railroader. It contains fifteen video chapters and eleven PDF files, all containing inspiration and simple, step-by-step instructions. I was particularly inspired by George Sellios' interview. At one point, he states, "What's unusual about the layout is that no planning went into it . . . maybe I'll do a little sketch before I start a certain area. . ." Well, I figure if the 23 'x 42' Franklin and South Manchester Railroad could be built with as little planning as that, I definitely didn't have to spend any more time laboring over my layout. So, to paraphrase Epictetus, "If you want to build a railroad, build." I went down to the basement and put together the framework for two more sectional pieces of my layout. I then did a quick analysis of what sections I need to concentrate

on to get up and running as soon as possible. I've changed my master plan: Instead of starting with the heavily tracked downtown areas, I'm going to sketch out those areas for right now, and just build the mainline, with one or two turnouts to provide variety and access to the future, more complex yards. With the Styrofoam® I've collected every time I needed to rent a flatbed truck from my local home improvement store, along with my trusty foam cutter, I should be well on my way in relatively no time. But wait, the DVD held one more advantage: not only was my grandson enthralled by the video, my wife found herself saying "We can do that" more than several times during the video.

So now, this article comes full circle from last month's Freudian slip, because, before you know it, *We'll* have a nice little layout.

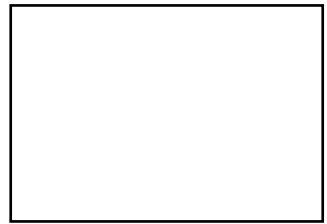
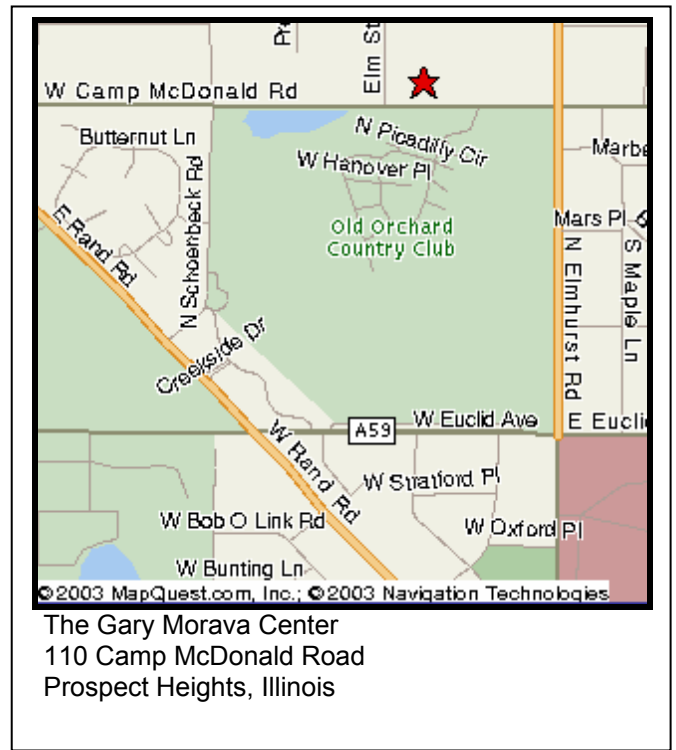
