of the Otis residence. The division will provide lunch and refreshments to all attendees. Jim's address is 1014 E. Jules, Arlington Heights, telephone: 847-255-5160.

Jim began modeling in the 1960's and started the FR & SC RR in 1978. Jim believes that his G scale garden railroad may be one of the oldest in the country - using one of the first LGB locos imported into the Chicago area. The garden RR is DCC controlled, features layout sounds and includes beautiful gardens through his wife Judy's efforts.

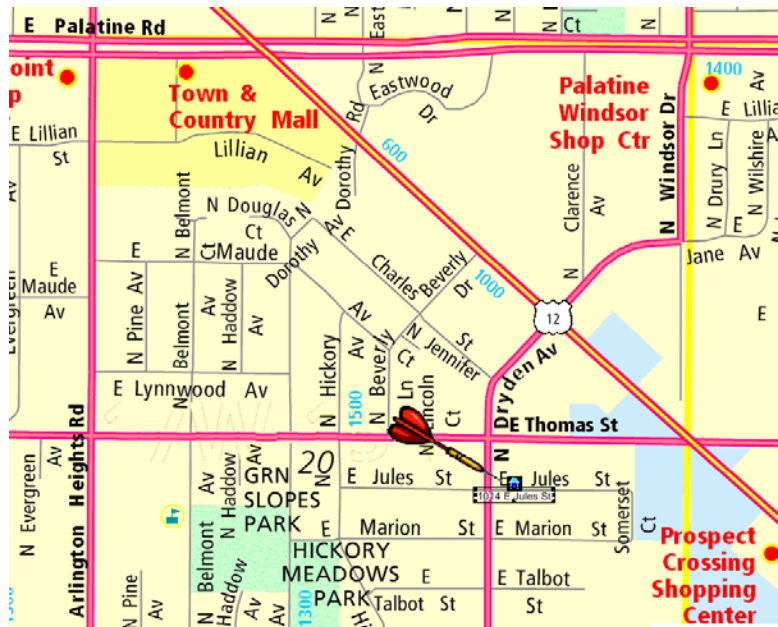
Jim also has an HO scale version of the FR & SC RR in his basement. This layout is centered around Milwaukee Road colors and equipment. At the start of the visit, Jim will acquaint us with both the story behind the FR & SC RR and how it came into existence:

"It is the result of two failing silver mines - one at Fall River and the other at Stony Creek. For business reasons, a merger was proposed, but success required connecting trackage rights from the nearby Milwaukee Road. Deals were cut, and the merger created the FR & SC RR. As the mines became once again profitable with the discovery of gold, rail

traffic blossomed, towns grew, and the rest is history...."

Regular layout activity includes a 6 car, all brass, *Hiawatha* train set. In addition to the *Hiawatha*, and manifest trains, there are several other passenger sets running between Fall River and Stony Creek. The layout is DCC equipped and can be automatically controlled by a computerized route control system if so desired. The layout planning for this route started in the 1970's and is currently the last of 4 configurations. Jim also displays a great deal of RR memorabilia - including exquisite sets of china from the *Hiawatha* trains. Jim chose the indoor/outdoor combination for good reason - one for winter and one for summer. Makes sense to me!
