

According to *Model Railroader Magazine's* April 2007 article on **Jon Addison's Silverton Central**, Jon had barely a year's modeling experience when he started building his exquisite Sn3 Silverton Central in 1996. Thanks to several key friendships Jon made early on in the hobby, Jon was able to build an outstanding model railroad "right out of the gate". Carl Tuozzo and Rick Guzzy helped with bench work, and master scratch builder Dan Bolda, and master scenery maker Richard Ranger guided Jon with his structure and scenery efforts. **Above**, a Silverton Central Mikado pulls a mixed freight across the high steel trestle over Gunnison River during my visit to the **Suncoast Center for Fine Scale Modeling** in February of 2019. SCFFSM's Sn3 Silverton Central Layout of the Month con't

The 6 x 24 foot Silverton Central is an island style layout originally built in sections so Jon could take it to train shows. The track plan is a large loop with just two turnouts. It was designed for display running, going by terrific scratch built structures and through gorgeous mountain scenery. Because the track plan is so simple, the layout is controlled by analog DC. Locomotives are equipped for sound with Soundtrax sound decoders set to run on DC. All the layout's locos are steam befitting the 1928-1935 era modeled, and the prototype which is Colorado 3 foot gauge railroads.

Jon Addison was inspired by several Colorado 3 foot railroads, in his interpretation of narrow gauge railroading in the Centennial State. The layout is set in the rugged Rocky Mountains. Lots of scratch built and upgraded commercial trees are seen everywhere. The structures on the layout are scratch built or highly modified and detailed kits which are "aged to perfection" with heavy weathering and distressing. Two long, high trestles—one wooden and one steel—are placed on each of the long sides of the layout. Also included on the layout, is a beautifully modeled small "cove" scene which occupies one end of the layout.

Like all of the layouts at the Suncoast Center, there are a variety of interesting mini-scenes placed all over the layout. One unique feature of the layout is appropriate sound effects which are only heard when a viewer comes near a particular scene. **Greg Bedleck** whose large, beautiful HO scale Great Northern Pacific layout was featured in several *Semaphore* Layout of the Month articles in recent years, devised a sensor system to activate the sound effects when a viewer comes near. Greg lived near Tampa prior to moving to Chicago's northwest suburbs ten years ago. *Con't on page 3*



Ahhh, Colorado 3 foot, narrow gauge steam! Who doesn't like that especially in the slightly larger Sn3 scale? Pictured on this page is Silverton Central's 2-8-2 #461 pulling a mixed freight past a stone engine house (above), and over the long, tall wood trestle spanning the Animus River (right). The SC's track is commercial code 70 flex track by Micro Engineering that has been painted, weathered, and buried in cinder ballast. The trestle, trees, wood retaining wall and low lying hunting and fishing lodge at right were all scratch built by layout builder Jon Addison.

The Suncoast Center is a 2,800 square foot museum celebrating fine scale modeling not only with model railroads, but with more than a dozen large scale military dioramas. Snow is a fact of life in the Rockies and the Silverton Central fights it with a permanently attached plow on one of its 2-8-0s (above left). We just barely see the caboose of a train rounding the bend at the town of Ouray (above right).

At right is a shot of the Silverton side of the layout. Note the shadow box effect created by the black valence and black curtains hanging from the black fascia. Just to the left of the viewer is the tall wood trestle over the Animus River. The bench work here drops down 18 inches below the height of the main line. Below is the Palmer Building Supplies building with a busy rooftop bar and grill, and a second floor room to rent. Mr. Palmer knows how to maximize revenue with his building!

I cut my model railroading teeth on American Flyer trains back in the 1950s. So when I came across this old Flyer caboose at a train show a few years ago, I *had* to have it. It is not the AF S scale most everyone is familiar with, but an honest to goodness *tin plate, O scale*, caboose. It was made in *Chicago* by the American Flyer Manufacturing Co. in its seven story plant on Halstead Street in about 1930. The company was bought by A.C. Gilbert in 1938 and moved to New Haven, Connecticut. Gilbert dropped O scale trains in 1941 in favor of S and HO. Cost for this little gem? A mere \$5.00!


