
# THE SEMAPHORE

The town of Sugar Camp on Steve Miazga's N Scale *Missabe Junction Railway* graces this month's *Semaphore* cover. Steve's MJR setting is northern Wisconsin and loaded with scads of excellent structures - most of which were scratch built and detailed by Steve. The 22 x 25 foot operations-orientated layout is completely decorated & runs smoothly in accordance with Steve's operating schedule and his watchful, dispatching eye. 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### Throttle up and get those trains moving...

I have been busy decorating the area around the recent quarry addition. Before he moved to Florida, David Leider donated a nifty flower shop and green house to the layout. I've finally gotten around to integrating it into the pike. I stopped by a couple of the local green houses for ideas. They all had several fields filled with various colorful plants throughout the gardening season next to the green houses. I set out to "grow some flowers" around my green house.

I started out with a **Small Plowed Field** mat made by Busch as a basis for the plantings. It's basically a corrugated cardboard slab with one of the cardboard faces peeled off. It's covered with their earth ground cover material. Pictures are worth a 1000 words so here are some snaps of the process steps.



1) The initial layout of the building placements



2) Paper mock-ups of the garden sizes



3) Field mats cut to size.



4) White glue dribbled on the top of the furrows



5) Grass flock sprinkled on the glue. Shake off excess when dry.



6) Various shades of green leaves added.



7) Colored flower petals added with additional glue on top of the leaves. Shake the excess off between steps.



8) Finished mats tested in place.



9) Mats glued to the layout. The cardboard wanted to ripple up so I had to pin it down until dry.



10) Additional ground cover and grasses applied to blend the fields into the scene. This is a nice way to add some color to a space. Still more to do to finish the scene, but I am satisfied so far.



Here's 4 other farm fields I "planted" using the same technique and materials shown above.

I am confident you'll get the idea of the process from the photos. Materials I used were:

- 1/8" Busch Small Field Plowed Field mat 189-7183
- Busch Micro Ground Scatter Material 189-7046
- Various scenic grasses, flowers & flocking material
- White glue

Have some fun and plant something on your layout.



#### The Missabe Junction Railway, cont'd....

The *MJR* is located in Waukesha Wisconsin about an hour north of the IL/WI border, and it is a great railroad to see. I've included a bunch of pictures I took at a recent operating session. They speak for themselves.



A shuttle is picking up tourists at Pelican Rapids for trip up to view the the northern territories of Wisconsin.



Above is a view along the northern edge of the layout. Missabe Jct. Yard and engine facility is on the right with Highland Jct. on a ridge above the yard in the middle, and a 4 track staging yard is along the left edge.



The town of Fredric borders the western side of the RR. The right spur services several industries; the center main line and passing track all head to the north staging yard.



Fly fishermen are enjoying the cool waters of a stream below Fredric as well as getting some train watching in at the same time.




The Pelican Rapids Industries

This is Oneida and it is a real brain-twisting, switching puzzle.




A long view of Alister yard
