


Bridges of Vermont by Mike Wood, FVD ...

Mike Wood (FVD) entertained us at the November meet with an east coast photo blog including the ins and outs of booking a trip on the Conway Scenic Railroad in New Hampshire. He also rode the Mt. Washington Cog Railroad in New Hampshire. Mt. Washington claims to have the worst weather in the lower 48, and Mike's photo account documented it. 60 mph gales and snow on an autumn day - all for the love of trains! We thank Mike for taking time to share his trip experience with the Fox Valley Division.


During his trip out east, Mike visited some very scenic covered bridges. He shared a few of his excellent photos with the **Semaphore**. Is this a future clinic presentation? Gives us something to think about.



The Fisher Covered Railroad Bridge, Wolcott, Vermont is shown in the three pictures on this page. Built in 1908, it originally carried the St. Johnsbury and Lamoille County Railroad over the Lamoille River. It was the last covered bridge in Vermont to carry railroad traffic and is a rare, surviving example of a double Town lattice truss. Something for Vermont RR enthusiasts to treasure.



Fisher Bridge over the Lamoille River near Wolcott, Vermont (above and below.) Note the stone abutments and the wood center support piles. This would be a very interesting prototype scene and structure to model.



Cole Hill Road crossing Sterling Creek in Morristown, Vermont. This 1896 red bridge is shown below.





The Scribner Covered Bridge, also known as the Mudgett Covered Bridge, carried Rocky Road across the Gihon River off State Route 100C in eastern Johnson, Vermont. This bridge's construction date and builder are not known.



Schoolhouse Bridge in Lyndon Vermont (below). Formerly spanning the South Branch Passumpsic River on South Wheelock Branch Road. The bridge's construction date and builder are not known.



Montgomery Bridge (below) is also known as the Lower or Potter Bridge on Montgomery Bridge Road. Off Route 109 near Waterville, Vermont, it's a 70 foot span over the North Branch of the Lamoille River. Built 1887, its builder is unknown.









Hopkins Bridge Lattice type near Montgomery, VT was built by Jewett Brothers 1875 shown above.
