
# THE SEMAPHORE

Rich Sieben has been keeping his trains moving in a big way. Last month Keith Dart reported on a mega-operating session at Rich's N Scale *Chicago Industrial Terminal Railway*. He has recently added a Steel Mill operation to the layout. The following pictures and captions are provided by Rich.




Above is the steel mill in operation; tracks in front are the industry support yard buildings from right to left, electric furnace, rolling mill and engine/ car shop. The trackage of the B Kruser yard and engine terminal are shown below.



Finally, the Royal Pane in the Glass factory and tallow rendering plant scene is being developed. The support yard to the far right is only partly visible. You can see the track crew is very busy!




Another view (below) of the Mill and Industry complex that's sure to keep the best operators challenged. Yikes!

#### Milwaukee Road Southwest Division, cont'd...

Superintendent Mike Hirvela and I had the opportunity to visit Gail & Gordy's Milwaukee Road layout for a status update this winter. Progress since the last visit during December of 2019 is significant. All the track work is in place and operating. Gordy is currently busy developing the railroad's operating scheme, schedules and associated documentation. He has 4 cycle waybills for car routing in place and has recently completed fascia town maps showing the local trackage and industries to be serviced. Gail continues to use her structure building skills to fill out the towns. She has completed over 100 scratch built, kit-bashed and kit built structures to populate the railroad. Pictures of the layout follow; they speak for themselves.



Our photo tour starts out at the staging and engine facility just west of Davenport, IA. Gordy models in the transition era.



The opposite end of the 32 foot long staging yard houses the diesel engine facility. The wye visible at the back of the scene heads east to Davenport or east to Ottumwa, IA on this layout (pictured on the cover page.) Nahant yard and engine facility is just west of Davenport and is pictured below.



Along the route toward Muscatine, we pass Gordy's *Electric Museum* and the Linwood Quarry and a gravel sorter. Gordy has a number of antique traction units on display at the museum.







The REX Agency shown above, along with AC Brown Mfg., Golden Valley Canning and Valley Mellon Packing. They anchor the Muscatine yard at the west end of town.

The Prairie Co-op, Prairie Star Milling Co, the Washington Depot, Purina Feed Supply and the Cities Service Oil Company are all served by the Milwaukee Road in Washington, IA. Note the underpass next to the depot. Gail put a mirror inside to reflect the traffic traveling through the underpass. It's a nice effect.







Gail has built some nice bridges on the pike. The upper photo of the small trestle is the first scratch built bridge she constructed. Note that the grass is starting to grow on the pike. The rural road bridge above is the very first kit built by Gail. We all remember our first structures!



Hurley Coal is located just outside of Lindby. The Lindby CB&Q intg. & tower can be seen in the foreground of the picture below.



#### Fun Stuff... What the heck happened here?

64 years ago a freight train mysteriously disappeared from the Chicago and Northwestern yard in Manitowoc and was found later that morning in the water of the Two Rivers harbor. The engine and cars were recovered 5 days later. The train crew parked the train of 9 cars for a breakfast break. Later that day, it traveled about 10 miles -- ultimately reaching 50-60 mph. Police investigations found that the throttle had been advanced by someone never found. New track had to be laid up to the river's edge to move the "Big Hook" from Green Bay close enough to the wreck to fish it out of the river with the help of two barge cranes. The other beautiful serendipity about the visit is the fact that the rail cars on display are a WWII Pullman Troop Sleeper (#8731) (which my father is utilizing 'en masse' as part of his UP North Platte [NE] Canteen) and an EJ&E Cupola caboose #503 for my own Rondout usage.
