

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Keep Those Trains Moving, by Jim Osborn, MMR...

FVD's Jim Landwehr & I promoted the NMRA by judging an NMRA style model contest at the *O scale meet held at the Lombard Westin on April 2nd*. There were 30+ entries to judge. Here are a few of the Merit class models we saw.



Bill Heaton of Elizabethan, TN entered his kit-bashed and expertly finished *Southern RR #6350 Ms4 Mikado Locomotive and Tender*.



Greg Cygnar of Huntley, IL displayed this scratch-built and finely detailed *Abandoned Warehouse*.



Jim Zwernemann of Cedar Creek, TX entered the *SLRX* #6069 Bunkerless 36' reefer and the Louisiana & Arkansas/ Kansas City Southern Waycar #386 shown above. Both models are excellent scratch built examples.



The detailed finishing on this scratch-built *Old Factory* by Dave Field of Huntley , IL really sets off this outstanding example.



Check out the interior detailing of this C&NW Mullet River steam-era caboose by Jim Schneider of New Berlin, WI.



You almost want to go through the doors and up to the counter to buy a steak at *Herman Lohe's Meat Market*. This Display Category entry was expertly done by John Dramm of Waunakee, WI. John is a member of the South Central Wisconsin Division of the NMRA.



This scratch-built *C&NW Bi-Level Commuter Coach #67* by David Schultz of Canyon, MN has a complex and fully detailed interior. Of course, I'm partial to the color scheme!

This was my 3rd year judging the model contest at this huge O Scale show. I am always impressed by the variety of models, the expertise and the diversity of entries from all over the country.....

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I will conclude with a modeling tip I picked up from Don Drum, fellow C&NW HO Scale modeler of Bayside, WI. He found a link to make a nifty *Kadee* style uncoupling tool that works great. Check out https://vimeo.com/689003993

The short video shows the story behind the tool and how to easily make it. All you need are some 6" long x 1/8" wood skewers and *GUM Proxa Brush* parts. I was able to find brush refills which avoided having to cut apart the brush handle shown in the video. Here's a picture of the components and finished product below that.

The uncoupling tool works great on HO scale couplers















Santa Maria Valley Railroad Visit and Op Session By Rich Sieben...

I had the chance to operate on Mike Jordan's Santa Maria Valley Railroad March 24, 2022. Mike is a former NMRA member and lives in White Bear Lake, MN. The HO layout depicts the **SMVRR** between Guadalupe and Santa Maria California all in a 12'x20' footprint. The only connecting railroad is the Southern Pacific. The staging yard uses 'active staging' and the yard clerk (Mike Jordan) determines the need for the specific cars and selected for outbound trains. While there are various customers on the railroad, fruit and vegetable packing is the primary purpose of the line. Mike uses a unique method for the movement of refrigerator cars that simulates steps such as pre-cooling, icing, postcooling and even re-icing using a punch card for each car. (Who hasn't always wanted to use a conductor's ticket punch?) The system is well thought out, and it took me a 2-hour session to swap about 6 cars in and 6 cars out of the packing district (which is a really fun switching puzzle.) It is not a "pull all cars and replace with new ones'" type of operation. Cars are typically re-spotted 3 or 4 times before they leave the packing district as per the steps above.





The Guadalupe main yard, with Can Can Canning to the left & Cal Coast Packing Plant #3 in left background are shown above. This is a compact yard for branch inbound/branch outbound and for East and West cars.



The Sunkist packing building (above) was designed by Bob Samus. The green truck indicates the clean out track for refrigerator cars. The Santa Maria main yard below has a cut of reefers to be iced and spotted or spotted and then iced. The pre-cooling plant is on the left by the ice dock. Note the ramp to the lower level in the foreground.

Two foot by six foot packing plant module, with 4 packing plants and 13 car spots, shown above.



A switch lead out of the Guadalupe yard and the Santa Maria Valley Industrial Railroad main line along the back ground, past the water tower and through a local orange grove. Note the lower level staging below the main line.



Parts and pieces of a Walthers Gravel kit are in the back-ground and an oil loading facility in the fore-ground. The lower level shows the Southern Pacific main line connecting the lower and upper levels via an uncoiled helix, ramp pictured above.



More SMVIRR industries, Cal Coast Packing Plant #2 and Ingles Grey Oil supply company in the back-ground above.



Farmer's Supply (in the fore-ground,) Sears' distribution building (tucked in the corner) and the first indication of the Sunkist packing plant on the left.

Lower level engine tracks, the first hint of the Pacific Ocean along the backdrop, and signs of a recent earthquake at the caboose service track above.



On the left above, another view of the ramp connecting the two levels and a shot of the main staging yard that represents, both San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara, for north and southbound trains. Finally, Holly Sugar, main customer on the Santa Maria Valley Railroad, received train loads of sugar beets and shipped car loads of sugar and tank cars of molasses. Note the G.E. 70 ton locomotive, the mainstay of power on the SMVIRR.



This was a great railroad to operate on with plenty of interesting industrial moves to make. Contact me for details and check it out if you get the chance. R. S.


