

N Scale Parsons Creek Coal Co Drift Mine by Robert Osburn, MCR - 2nd Place - Scratch Built Structures.







Mike's Minute...



A minute, or two or even three this time. Last month I noted our May 15 meeting would be a 'hybrid' session with an in-person meeting at the Morava Center in Prospect Heights AND virtual presence via the Zoom computer system. First, to let everyone know, we had 15 members

at the Morava Center, from 12 different communities, from Chicago and Lincolnwood to Crystal Lake and Sleepy Hollow; and several in-between. My thanks to those who journeyed to Prospect Heights to participate. Those present took advantage of beverages and a special cake that Denis Z arranged (p.s.: there was none left over). I also wanted to let you know we had 14 or more members logging in over the Zoom system, locally and from distance. Thank you for your participation. Let me know your experience with this.

As I wrote last month, using the technology that exists today, it would seem an easy proposition to put such a combination meeting together. However, we are not a TV station and we had to make sure certain requirements could be fulfilled: WI-FI bandwidth, hardware and software compatibility, hook-up cables and power cords running on the floor between the components, WI-FI connections, Zoom system hosting and monitoring while another computer has the Power Point slides, external plug-in presentation with share-screen issues, microphone locations and etc., etc., etc. We did experience some audio issues as the microphone on my laptop all-of-a-sudden didn't work, and our audio output via an amplifier in the meeting room didn't work either. To give you an idea of what we dealt with, Mr. Osborn had his computer hosting the Zoom meeting on one side of the room using the building WI-FI, while I had my computer on a podium on the other side of the room with my zoom log-on and the power point slides. My laptop was using an HDMI cable to the digital projector (to show the laptop screen on the big movie screen), and the audio feed ran from the digital projector to an audio amplifier feeding a floor speaker. When we couldn't get the microphone on my laptop to work, Mr. Osborn set up a tablet computer, tied into the zoom system via WI-FI and we used that for audio feed only. Things went well once I remembered to 'share screen' and we got through the first part of the program. We then had our feature presentation, and that's where some rehearsal would have helped. We could have planned better and thought about how to focus on the demonstration item the presenter brought along using the tablet camera and audio while keeping the power point slides going on the

display screen for the audience to follow. Blame it on our inexperience with manipulating equipment (we'll work on that) as we can only do one focused item at a time [we don't have a TV control room full of equipment.] There was a bit of jumbling of hardware to muddle through the presentation (we'll work on that, too). After our break, we had the contest results and the 2nd part of the program. So, were we successful? Folks who were present provided positive feedback and were appreciative of our efforts. Overall, I would call the meeting successful. Need feedback from the Zoom world. Based on our experience, our first meeting in September will be similar and hopefully smooth.

The Tri-Region Convention in Indianapolis was held May 18th – 22nd with over 500 registered attendees, including NMRA President, Gordy Robinson; several national board members and folks we know from our Zoom sessions, such as Dave Ackmann from Missouri, who provided us a clinic and templates for billboards, and Steve Priest, former editor of RMC. As you can tell, I had a great time.

I'm excited about the 2022 NMRA National Convention in St. Louis August 7-15. Sign-up now if you haven't. The list of clinics, tours and events definitely will fill a week.

I'm also looking forward to our first meeting of the Fall season on September 18th with great anticipation to hear "what you did on your summer vacation." And you could make that a Power Point slide photo presentation that we can include in our schedule.

Be on the lookout for the "Orange Card" with information on our 2022-2023 season. The dates are set and the clinic presenters are being scheduled. Alway check the *Timetable* web page on our website for the latest information on each division meeting. The meeting notices come out by e-mail, so be sure we have your current e-mail address and advise of any change. Our webmaster sends out the meeting notice with the ZOOM system log-on credentials to make it easy to use the Zoom system if you'd rather participate that way.
