

Keep Those Trains Moving by Jim Osborn, MMR...

I have to confess that I did not keep my trains moving a lot over the summer. Some travel, outings, outdoor projects and too many Covid naps dominated my days. I did finally get in gear and spent some time doing a bit of landscaping around the *Steve's Scrap and Salvage* scene I started a while ago. I wanted to add some weeds around the corrugated metal fence surrounding the perimeter.

I had some *Woodland Scenics* field grasses in my scenery stash that I decided to put to use. The directions said to use their Hob-e-tac® glue to attach the grass. I did not have good results with that method: most of the grasses wanted to flop over, and it was difficult to grasp and hold the grass bundles with my tweezers. Plus the glue is reflective and showed up when you take a flash picture. I



needed a new process. The field grasses I had are shown above. After thinking about it, I had an idea that worked very well. Now, I have to confess that I do not know if I read about this process a while ago and was a déjà vu or it was something new - but it worked so well I want to share it with you.

The basic process is to make a hole and shove the grasses into the hole folded in half. I made a push tool with a large

sewing needle jammed into a hole I'd drilled in the end of a small dowel. I ground the eye end of the needle off and cleaned the burrs up to make a smooth, forked slot in the end. The tool below has grasses in the needle slot.



I used a thin ice pick to make a hole the scenery base (you might have to use a drill if your are using a plywood base).



I cut the grasses in half and then loaded up the shoving tool fork with a mixture of grasses depending on the colors needed. I then pushed the tool into the hole - which folded the bundle in half. Pulling the tool out slowly left



the grasses in place. I cemented the grass with a couple of drops of unscented hairspray. I use a jelly jar with a hole

drilled in the lid that fits a pipette to keep the hairspray fresh.

The new - planted grasses are shown below. Resist the temptation to futz with the them until the hairspray is dry and the grasses are fixed in place. Then you can clean up the loose bits and trim the grass to the desired lengths. Trim randomly so you do not end up with them looking like a "3 Stooges haircut." A final pass with a vacuum will clean





up the scene. Add a few tufts of grass and some ground foam and you'll have an interesting addition to a scene.



Don't forget to plant some weeds around fences, ponds, foundations or right of ways! And always remember.....





Tom Heilman's Midwest Rail Layout by Rich Sieben

During the RiverRail 2022 event (La Cross), we had the pleasure of operating on Tom Heilman's Midwest Rail layout. The layout is a double-decked free-lance with good size runs and plenty of switching. We had a dispatcher and 5 operators. This HO scale layout occupies the second floor of a 4 car garage, 2 cars wide and 2 cars deep in Winona, MN. The layout is divided into 20 zones; with some jobs defined by the zones. For example, I ran the zone 18-19 turn which ran between the yard and work near the end of the layout. I switched a brewery, grain elevator, chemical plant and fuel distributor in that area. The operating plan and pacing is well thought out as there is plenty of room to work for both people and trains. I took a few pictures shown here to share with our division.

Notice the many farm-related industries as this is supposed to be in a generic Midwest area with some city features as well. The lower deck here is the approach to one of the two yards (one for eastbound and the other for westbound traffic). Steel mill on top and auto plant and other industries on the bottom deck.





The iron mine (on the bottom) is off on it's own branch line. Above it is another branch line that requires plenty of switching to be done.

Thomas plans to run about 26 trains during a session but usually gets about 18 -22 actually out. He runs his own trains frequently between sessions to find and correct problems such as coupler heights, turnouts, locomotive issues, etc.

The optimum number of operators is 8, but the RR can run with fewer. For a group of 5 or less, there is no dispatcher, and trains going thru the classification yards do their own switching. A yardmaster isn't required.

It was a fun layout to operate on, and the session ran flawlessly. Thomas welcomes visitors; so if you are interested, contact me for the details. R.S.
