Keep Those Trains Moving by Jim Osborn, MMR...

Last month I really liked Jim Landwehr's "Pipe Load" contest entries and felt they warranted further discussion. Jim was happy to share the process he used with me. Photos of his work are on the front page of this issue.

Jim found a variety of "fat" straws of different sizes on the Amazon on-line marketplace. It turns out that "fat" straws are used for pulpy or otherwise thick drinks. The paper straws he chose were up to a half inch in diameter. There were a number of challenges he had to address in crafting the loads.

First he had to figure out how to cut the straws squarely and cleanly to the correct load lengths. His solution was to insert an appropriately sized wood dowel into the straw and chuck the dowel and straw into his drill press. He created a fixture that held a horizontal #11 X-acto blade at the correct height and turned on the drill press. By carefully touching the blade against the rotating straw and dowel, he was able to efficiently create a clean cut on the paper straw.

With the straws cut, Jim sealed the paper with polyurethane (shellac would also do the job). The sealer also filled the paper wrap seam on the straw. When dry, he then air brushed the exterior of the "pipes". He hand brush painted the interior ends of the pipes with either the same exterior color or a contrasting color for effect.

Finally, he used narrow detailing tape to make the load straps. [Berkshire Junction elastic EZ-line also used for scale telephone lines makes great load strapping. Ed.] He bunked and strapped the pipes into load-sized piles. The results speak for themselves.

This got me thinking, I haven't seen a red crimson maple tree on any one layout. I've seen some of the orange sugar maples but not red maples. I am going to give it a try and will report my results next month. I have some fine red ground cover in my scenery materials bin. I think I will spray a dusting of silver paint on the upper part of the armature

before adding red "leaves" to try and get the shimmery effect of the back of the maple leaves. I did a web search and did not find much on a process other that commercial products. If anyone has tried making red-leafed trees, let me know your process and I will share it in my next report on the topic. Take care and keep those trains moving! J. O., Ed.



Mike's Minute ...



We hosted the Fall Mid-West Region Board of Directors meeting in person and over-the-net prior to our division meet on October 16. A number of topics were discussed including developments underway for the Regional Advisory Council whose members advise the NMRA National

organization. Issues involve some serious stuff regarding IRS 501-c status of MWR divisions (some have it - some don't) and liability insurance or bonding for officers of the organization. For the average member this does have an impact because IF the division gets a 501-c (3) status, any funds contributed are charitable and certain IRS rules apply. Liability insurance or bonding covers decisions and actions of the members of the Region and Division Board members. Some actions might be challenged given the litigious nature that anyone can file lawsuit for almost anything. Some protection for the individuals who are representing you, the members, is being looked into. Certain situations are known to have occurred in other divisions which have had repercussions. While I don't think any of members would object to what the BoD decides, I hope any member can feel free to discuss any concern with me.

The MWR BoD also discussed meeting on Saturday vs. Sunday. While that may seem not to be a big deal to the FVD, about half of the MWR divisions host meetings on Saturday. Meeting in person, traveling to meetings in different cities and weather concerns, were discussed (including continuing to use the Zoom System as a method to attend from afar.) Also discussed were future MWR conventions, location and hosting requirements. As we have noted, there will not be a convention in 2023 for a variety of reasons. The MWR Board is working on coordinating a convention for 2024, location and host(s) TBA. More info to follow.

The MWR is looking for candidates for Director-At-Large. We need at least one more volunteer to fill the slate of candidates for a two-year term. The incumbents are term-limited and cannot run for office. The D-A-L position qualifies for NMRA Official certificate after 3 years in office. So, if you volunteer and get elected, serve satisfactorily, get re-elected, serve satisfactorily again, you can add an AP certificate toward Master Model Railroader. Additionally, as a D-A-L, you are on the MWR BoD and can contribute to a 1,500 person, 5-state region, rather than just the Fox Valley division. Contact me if you are willing to help.

After the MWR BoD concluded, several of the board members stayed and attended our regular FVD monthly meeting. We had 37 attendees, both in-person (25) and over the Zoom System (12). [Side Note: We had some left-over food items from the MWR lunch and additional snack items which were available to members attending: one of the gents from the Rock River Valley Division (Rockford and vicinity) asked if we would like to attend one of their meetings provided we bring along the snacks! Back to the meeting: We had a different audio system for this meeting, and I understand the presentations overthe-net came through clear. Please let me know if you had any difficulties. The presenter of the feature topic was from Cleveland, OH, and I noted a number of members taking notes as he described his use of certain common everyday products for our model railways in ways we didn't anticipate. I found it informative – a "Why didn't I think of that?" moment. Our Programs and Clinics Trainmaster Gary Saxton, has some other great topics coming up this season. Be sure to check our website for updates in the months ahead as the season progresses.

I'll mention again the division has elections coming up in April 2023 for Assistant Superintendent and Paymaster. We exist on volunteers to help the continued success of the division. Think about it and let me or any board member know of your interest. Points under "Official" in the Achievement Program are earned for service to the division.

At this time, we are planning on holding Hybrid In-person/Zoom meetings for the entire season. Specific meeting notice details are sent out via e-mail one week before each meet, so be sure we have your current e-mail address on file and always advise of any changes.
