

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## Keep Those Trains Moving by Jim Osborn, MMR...

Last month I commented about the season's spectacular fall colors. Here's a snap I took of a crimson red maple two houses north of my home. The picture got me thinking about how to make a crimson maple for my layout. Here's the inspirational photo again:



Well I gave it a try as promised last month. I dug through a box of *Super Tree* Armatures to find a stalk with the appropriate shape. After straightening out the sprig, I did some trimming to enhance the shape. I sprayed the trunk with camouflage tan. While it dried, I searched for the right "leaves." I had some red *Woodland Scenic* "flowers" in my scenery materials bin. Unfortunately, I found them to be too bright a red. So I let the project lie idle for a day while I thought it through.

I noticed that the leaves were just coming off a Japanese Maple tree in our back yard. They had a nice, burgundy colored leaf perfect for the project. I further found that the leaves on the ground under the tree still retained their color - not yet turning brown like the other tree leaves. (Maybe because there is less chlorophyll in the red leaves?) Hence red all year round and not green? Well that's a question for another day.

I gathered the fallen leaves and let them dry in the basement for a day. I was pleased that they retained their nice burgundy color. I stuffed them in my "hobby material assigned blender" and ground the pile up. After picking the chaff out I have a nice pile of burgundy leaves.

I sprayed the Super Tree trunk with 3M "77" spray glue and rained the leaves down on the branches. Here's a close-up of the result:



Not perfect - a little droopy - but pretty close... I have more leaves to practice with - and they are staying red! As my wife Mary often says, "If a man on a galloping horse can't tell the difference, it's good enough!" I'll take that as a win in this case - she approved! Now I need to get the shovel out and do some planting on my pike.

# Doug Taylor's *Pennsylvania RR and East Broad Top* by Rich Sieben...

I attended the Prairie Rail 2022 event Oct 28-30 in Kansas City. These were the first two operating sessions, EBT was run Friday afternoon and the PRR Saturday morning. Below is Doug Taylor's description of the layout: "The East Broad Top Railroad is a HO 3, foot, narrow gauge, coal hauling railroad in South Central Pennsylvania. This modern, steam-powered railroad runs south from the dual gauge interchange with the Pennsylvania at Mount Union, through the shop and headquarters town of Orbisonia, the Ganister rock quarry town of Saltillo, and terminates at the mines of Robertsdale.

The point-to-point EBT system features coal trains, rock trains, mixed freight, passenger and gas electric operations with modern steel equipment. Crew requirements are a dispatcher, Orbisonia yardmaster, Mount Union yardmaster, and 4 road crews. Communications is by vintage telephones.

The Pennsy Railroad is a fully separate, standard gauge HO layout that occupies a 36 ft by 48 ft portion of the basement. The design was adapted from a John Armstrong design and features legendary Pennsy scenic elements like the four-track Horseshoe Curve. The Pennsy is fully signaled with position-light signals.

As you can see from the pictures, this amazing layout shows off Doug's modeling skills. The EBT was interesting to operate because plenty of switching was involved. I operated the dual gauge yard at Mt. Union where EBT trains terminated and sent empty hoppers back up the mountain to the mines. There is an "empties out and loads in" operation. A steep grade inside the mountain leads to the upper end of the layout where the loaded cars come out of the mine.




