

## Division News by Jim Osborn, MMR...

It started with a simple tick box that needed to be checked to allow the video audio to be shared with the zoom audience and quickly turned out to be a disaster. The new audio system does its job, but it is sort of a house-of-cards with three laptops in the room required to run the hybrid meeting.

In an attempt to solve the video-audio problem, the video was moved to the meeting host laptop with no success. Then the Room Cam and audio laptop with no luck. We either had audio in the room or on the zoom system - but not both. Then audio feedback started. Well, adding the video to the Room Cam laptop was the last straw: doing so disconnected the room audio with feed back noise canceling. Unfortunately, once an audio path is changed

## Jon Percy's Buffalo and Pittsburgh Railroad by Rich Sieben...

As I wrote last month, I attended the Prairie Rail 2022 Operating Extravaganza in Kansas City. The second layout I visited during the sessions took me to *Jon Percy's Buffalo and Pittsburgh*. It's an N Scale empire!

The *B&P* is the third railroad formed by Genesee & Wyoming Inc in the western New York and Pennsylvania region. It was created in 1988 from ex-CSX/B&O/Buffalo, Rochester, and Pittsburgh track running from Buffalo NY to New Castle PA.

The upper level of the layout features the 272' mainline from Buffalo to Butler PA and includes seven major switching areas. The lower level is the 109' Northern Subdivision, a branch serving three chemical plants. The layout depicts the railroad soon after startup in 1988. Crews operate a mix of second-hand and leased locomotives to switch multiple industries and yards. Low train density and high local switching characterize operations on the B&P.

Past Prairie Rails operators with real-world experience have commented that the layout captures the feel of a typical railroad job. Operating sessions are purposeful but leisurely - with lots of time to operate prototypically. Jon has the work planned out so crews from the upper and lower decks are not competing for space in the aisles.

I ran the Northern Subdivision switcher - it was fun and interesting. Since there were no other trains running through this division, I was able to leave cars for later pickup or spotting for facing point sidings. Having train-watched a similar type of run on the *Minneapolis, Northfield and Southern Railway,* (MNS) I have to say this layout, indeed, feels like the real thing.

#### Layout at a glance

- N scale
- 27 ft x 31 ft plus 14 ft x 14 ft in two rooms.
- Point-to-point plan with many prototypical track arrangements and lengths.
- Approximately 35 percent scenery completed.
- Session represents an 8-12 hour shift for two yard switchers and three local switchers. As crews finish jobs, they are assigned road freights and extras.
- Operators use train lists and switch lists and control trains with GML Enterprises wireless throttles.
- DC control system uses track blocks corresponding to Direct Traffic Control blocks.
- Dispatched by verbal track warrants.


We roll through an unusual amount of countryside on this pike as seen in the two pictures below.

Finally we reach the end of the trackage. We had to execute a run-a-round and head back to finish the job. Until the next run .... Rich Sieben.


## Fun Stuff by Jim Osborn .....

The January Presentation will feature Mike Wood educating us on the use of the NCE Switch IT-2 and the Switch IT-8. He will show us non-techies the simplicity of the Switch-IT 2 and that no knowledge of coding, programming or macros is needed -- just a few entries on your NCE cab to set things up.

He will expand to the Switch IT-8 with two examples: 1) for those who have existing turnouts wired up for push button operation and want to add the Switch IT-8 into the mix, and 2) introduce the concept of Macros to allow control of multiple turnouts simultaneously. 
