

FVD DIVISION MEET DECEMBER 21. Clinic Presentation: Tappets, dogs, bridles - Basics of Mechanical Interlocking - Part 2 - by Patrick Golden, DuPage Division. Part Two builds on Part One in that a mechanical interlocking "locking bed" is built step-by-step on the PowerPoint screen and then lineups are made to demonstrate how manipulating various levers lock out others and how levers are manipulated in a precise order to make lineups and clear signals. Trains are then "run" through the interlocking plant. A crossing (diamond) is introduced to demonstrate the need for "crossing" or "route" levers, trap circuits to protect the dead section of track at the diamond are discussed and time release mechanisms are discussed when it is necessary to take down a signal previously cleared in order to change a lineup. Don't miss this one! Bring a model of a load that spans 2 or 3 cars to show off your work.
